In Psalm 16, David sang, "Lord, you alone are my portion and my cup; you make my lot secure — with God at my right hand, I will not be shaken" (verses 5, 8).

changing times, and the One in whom we trust, we will not be shaken – not by a sinking economy or the onsets of war and social unrest. When we trust in God's provision, we are assured that He is our stability and security.


